



#### Messerschmitt Bf 109 E-3 'Black 7' 8./JG 27

Bad Zwischenhahn, Germany, late 1940. 'Black 7' is depicted as observed during the winter of 1940 when 8./JG27 withdrawn from the Channel Front to rest. Unusual for this period, is the lack of any mottling on the fuselage. Also note the RLM 71 finished rudder.




## 3(3) Looking at photo on page 362 of ref.one, we notice that the White squiggle could be angled down, not even with the cross. your choice!

#### Messerschmitt Bf 109 E-7 'White 1' 7/JG 2

Staffelkapitän Oblt. Werner Machold, Pas de Calais, France, winter 1940/41. Oblt. Machold was a holder of the Knights Cross. However, after his Staffel was re-designated as a Jabo unit, he was shot down and taken prisoner during a bombing sortie on 9 June 1941.

#### Messerschmitt Bf 109 E-3 'Yellow 5' 9/JG 54

Campagne, France, September 1940. 'Yellow 5' is shown wearing a typical camouflage scheme used by JG 54 around this period. This consisted of a cross-hatch of sprayed RLM 71 lines. Spinner could have been Black.

#### Messerschmitt Bf 109 E-4 Gruppenstab I/JG 26

Hptm. Rolf Pingel, Gruppenkommandeur Audembert, France, November 1940. The 5 flags beneath the cockpit represented countries in which Hptm. Pingel had fought. The fin carries the 17 victory markings which the pilot had claimed at this point in time.

General camouflage color RLM 71/02/65, with mottling in the same colors, unless otherwise noted.
