





Bf109G-14AS, assigned to 101/3 Fighter-bomber Squadron, April 1945. Camouflage is believed to be RLM 82/75/76 with 82/76 mottling on the fuselage sides. The aircraft also features a Yellow RLM 04 nose band and rudder. The propeller spinner was black.













Messerschmitt Bf109F-4 of 5/l 'Puma' squadron, Soviet Union, 1943. This machine wears the standard mid-war camouflage of RLM 74 Graugrūn & RLM 75 Grauviolett over RLM 76 Lichtblau – with yellow band and wing tips. Prop spinner is white and black. RLM 74/75 fuselage mottling. Photo evidence suggests that this aircraft might have worn larger size national markings beneath the wings. Paint the red and green areas of the fin, rudder and tail white, prior to applying the Green and Red stripes. Some slight trimming might be required when applying the decals to improve fit.

Bf109G-6 of 5/2 Fighter Squadron, 1943. The uppersurfaces painted in standard RLM 74/75 colors with a sparse mottle of both carried down the fuselage sides. The undersurfaces were RLM 76 with RLM 04 yellow spinner, nose under surface, wing tips and rudder. The propeller blades were most likely the standard RLM 70. Note the partially painted-out Swastika on the port fin. Not knowing the condition of the starboard emblem, we have provided both partial and complete Swastikas (27a+b).











Bf109F-4b of 1/1 fighter-bomber squadron, Eastern Front, 1943. The standard RLM 74/75 upper surfaces received a white distemper winter camouflage over RLM 76. The lower wing tips and fuselage stripe were RLM 04 yellow. The spinner, decorated with an unusual yellow spiral, appears to have been white, while the prop blades were RLM 70. Paint the red and green areas of the fin, rudder and tail white prior to applying the Green and Red stripes. Some slight trimming might be required when applying the decals to improve fit.
