



A color note about US Desert Camouflaged P-40's. These A/C did not wear the typical R.A.F. Desert Camouflage of Midstone, Dark Earth and Azure. Their upper surfaces were camouflaged with US Sand (616) and Dark Earth (30118). Contrary to what other publications say, it is our belief that

the undersurfaces were US Neutral Gray (ANA 43), which photographs very much like Azure Blue.

This is our opinion and we have no way to confirm or deny it. Carefully study your references and arrive at your own conclusions.
