


SUPERMARINE SPITFIRE Mk8/9

SUPERMARINE SPITFIRE Mk VIII or Mk IX

Single seat fighter 1:72 scale

The most famous British plane of World War 2, the Spitfire, was eventually produced in over 20 different Marks. The Mark 8 was designed to take the Merlin 61 engine with 1st two-speed, two stage supercharger and was intended to take on the high-High. FW. 190s which were then outclassing the earlier Spitfire 5s. The 9 came out before the 8, being basically an adaptation of the 5 with the 61 engine. Engine: 1,520 h.p. Rolls Royce Merlin 61. Max. speed: 408 m.p.h. at 25,000 ft. Service ceiling: 43,000 ft. Armament: two 20 mm cannon and four .303 machine guns.

To complete the aircraft as illustrated, you will need model aircraft paint. A display stand is not supplied with this model.

10 MODEL TIPS


If you desire to paint use appropriate model aircraft paints, taking as a guide either of the two illustrations, which are to be found under the front blister. Use the illustrations for correct selection and positioning of the transfers.

Caution

Gaution
Polystyrene cement is highly
inflammable. Keep away from naked
flame, and also from the face particularly the eyes and nose - and from
clothing. Use pin to open tube and
replace after use. Use sparingly.

Instructions Test assembly position and fit of parts before

cementing.
Assemble in sequence shown i.e. A.B.C.D. etc.
Note that the part numbers needed for each step are listed in the recommended assembly sequence.




Special Instructions Note the importance of locating the undercarriage lugs (Diag. C) before cementing wing sections together (Diag. D). Silhouettes denote different undercarriage positions for the various Marks.

















